The Suquamish Tribe Will Welcome

It Contributes to the Region's  
Economic Development at the  
House of Awakened Culture**

The Suquamish is one of many Indian Tribes in the Pacific Northwest. Taking their name from the traditional Lushootseed language phrase for "people of the clear salt water" these expert fisherman, canoe builders and basket weavers have lived in harmony with the lands and waterways along Washington's Central Puget Sound Region for thousands of years. The abundance of natural resources and efficient technology for harvesting and preserving food enabled them to develop a rich cultural and spiritual life.

Built by the Suquamish Tribe in 2008, the House of Awakened Cultures acts as a spiritual successor to the Old Man House, which was destroyed 1870 to disperse the tribe. Since its opening in 2009, the house has served as a community center for the Suquamish Tribe and the community. Construction of the House of Awakened Culture was a component of a larger revitalization campaign for the Suquamish Tribe, which also included construction of a new Suquamish Museum.
