The Old Chicago Post Office was originally completed in 1921, but underwent a monumental expansion in 1932 to meet Chicago's unprecedented postal needs. The meteoric rise of the mail-order industry, spearheaded by the Chicago-based Montgomery Ward and Sears catalogs, transformed the city into the distribution center of the nation nearly overnight. In its postal heyday, the property was the largest of its kind in the world, capable of shuttling an astonishing 19 million pieces of mail daily. Recent renovations have shifted the post office to a mixed-use building.

Anchored by BNSF and Union Pacific rail terminals, it handles international shipping containers arriving from coast to coast. These containers are quickly transferred to massive adjacent distribution centers serving companies like Amazon, Walmart, and many more. The port's layout minimizes trucking distances, reduces congestion, and supports a growing logistics workforce.
