Registry of Health Professionals that Provide Voluntary Services High-Level Commission for the Prevention and Control of Coronavirus

The High-Level Commission for the Prevention and Control of Coronavirus created an online platform for health professionals to register and offer voluntary services. Professionals include medical doctors, bio-analysts, and therapists. Their valuable skilled services will help support the response for Covid-19 patients in the Dominican Republic.

Messenger bot to facilitate information about health services Ministry of Public Health

The Ministry of Public Health Launched a messenger bot (web robot) called Aurora MSP to facilitate information about the coronavirus and health services. Aurora MSP servs as a direct communication channel to help connect possible Covid-19 patients with the healthcare system through text messages, voice notes, and video calls in multiple platforms such as Facebook, WhatsApp, or Telegram. More than 200 medical doctors are part of this network to provide information about symptoms, treatments, and recommendations while people stay at home or health centers.
