

ACE Seattle successfully delivered a productive full week-long program that brought together 80+ global and regional leaders from the Americas and beyond, including participants, special guests, local authorities and experts, and federal, regional, and multinational organizations. The week-long program took place in the Greater Seattle Region of Washington State, United States from May 14th to May 19th, 2023.

Over 710+ opportunities for collaboration have been registered in the final ACE Seattle survey with respect to possible trade and investment partnerships, new R&D projects, start-up soft-landing arrangements, sister city relationships, and business expansion, among others. The final survey demonstrated that the participants identified clear avenues of cooperation with Seattle's vibrant ecosystem and learned from best practices and models on economic development. Participants also enhanced their capacities and increased their awareness about the importance of pursuing inclusive economic growth.

During the exchange, delegates explored mutually beneficial partnerships to strengthen economic development in the Americas and beyond. ACE Seattle Participants also had the opportunity to pursue numerous collaborations with Seattle's globally renowned industries, including information and communication technologies, aerospace, life sciences, maritime, and global health.

ACE has consistently proven that it is a powerful driving mechanism for fostering cooperation and forming new partnerships. According to data drawn from the ACE Seattle final survey, 100% of the VIP global and regional leaders who responded to the survey expressed that ACE Seattle exceeded or greatly exceeded their expectations (49 participants out of 56 surveyed).



Delegates left the ACE Seattle event having discovered new ways to leverage the benefits and opportunities that the ACE network offers. High-level decision-makers identified ways to establish and strengthen global commercial relations and FDI partnerships, possible alliances to develop tools to achieve environmentally sound inclusive economic development, and up-to-date models to provide appropriate support for innovative businesses to startup and expand globally. Participants also learned strategies to better connect universities-industry-government to solve complex challenges that no one sector or player could address on their own.

ACE is the premier economic development, innovation, and entrepreneurial network of the Americas and is one of the leading high-level events of the Organization of American States (OAS). ACE is coordinated by the Executive Secretariat of Integral Development (SEDI) in partnership with the Government of the United States through the Department of State - Permanent Mission to the OAS - and the Department of Commerce (the Economic Development Administration -EDA- in coordination with the International Trade Administration-ITA-).

ACE Seattle was organized by the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) and the Washington Department of Commerce.





A little bit of history...

Created in 2014, the Americas Competitiveness Exchange (ACE) program is jointly implemented and supported by the General Secretariat of the Organization of American States and the Government of the United States, through the Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration (EDA) in coordination with the International Trade Administration (ITA), and the Department of State (Permanent Mission to the OAS).

The commitment of the OAS and the United States Government to ACE extends from the design and implementation phases to evaluation, monitoring, and reporting in collaboration with host countries and regions. The ACE initiative fosters an environment for establishing long-term partnerships, cooperation opportunities, and new projects, making it a network of networks and a community of impact.

With the implementation of 16th ACE Editions, the #ACXchange has evolved into a flagship hemispheric program, providing tangible long-term benefits to countries and communities involved.

What is the #ACXchange

The Americas Competitiveness Exchange (ACE) is the premier economic development, innovation, and entrepreneurial network in the Americas, earning recognition as one of the Organization of American States' (OAS) main high-level events. ACE operates as a core initiative of the Inter-American Competitiveness Network (RIAC), with the OAS acting as the RIAC Technical Secretariat.

RIAC is a regional platform that gathers high-level authorities and key stakeholders responsible for competitiveness, innovation, and economic development in the 34 OAS Member States and 71 Permanent Observers. By fostering policy dialogue, promoting the exchange of experiences, and facilitating collaborative initiatives among decision-makers

in the public, private, and academic sectors, RIAC aims to encourage inclusive and sustainable economic development across the Americas.



What are the ACE objectives?



Promoting long-term multilateral commercial, trade and investment partnerships among decision-makers of the Americas and beyond;



Identifying and sharing best practices in economic development, including public-private partnerships, building local assets that grow businesses, cluster development, promoting entrepreneurship and coordinating regional economic development strategies:

Sunday, May 14th - <u>Link to Video</u>



ACE Seattle began in the beautiful City of Seattle, Washington, often called the "Emerald City." The ACE participants were welcomed at the registration table, where they made first contact with other group members.



The participants visited the **Space Needle**, one of Seattle's most renowned landmarks built for the 1964 World's Fair. There, they had the opportunity to engage with conference organizers and network amongst themselves, all while taking in the sweeping city, Puget Sound, and mountain views from the observation deck.



Afterward, the ACE delegation traveled downtown via Monorail and walked to **Pike Place Market.**



Pike Place Market is one of the oldest and largest operating public markets in the United States, and home to hundreds of artisans, crafters, farmers, florists, and small business owners. ACE participants had the opportunity to tour the iconic market and to learn about how the city is committed to preserving it in ways that are not only sustainable, but that protect the legacy and the enduring functionality of the space.



Moving on to Seattle's Chinatown-International District, ACE delegates visited the **Wing Luke Museum**, an art and history museum focused on the culture, art, and history of Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders.



An ACE Welcome Reception was held at the museum, where opening remarks and welcoming messages were provided.



Monday, May 15th - Link to Video



The ACE Delegation gathered for a welcome breakfast at the **Columbia Tower Club**, situated atop the city's tallest skyscraper. Surrounded by stunning views, ACE Delegates forged invaluable connections, exchanged insights, and explored future projects with prominent leaders, representatives from the United States Department of State, the Economic Development Administration (EDA), and the Organization of American States (OAS).



The journey continued at the **University of Washington's Seattle campus**, where delegates delved into R&D opportunities and research collaborations through groundbreaking initiatives. First, they engaged with CoMotion, a vibrant innovation hub that cultivates creativity, provides advice on IP protection, sources of funding, mentorship, and fosters start-up innovation. Next, the Clean Energy Institute showcased collaborative possibilities with the Washington Clean Energy Testbeds, an innovative project accelerating the adoption of new technologies in solar harvesting, energy storage, and system integration.



Delegates then visited **Microsoft's** expansive campus, where they explored the tech company's crucial role in driving digital transformation. Lively discussions touched on workforce development, responsible AI, emerging technologies, and cloud computing, offering valuable insights into the ever-evolving global tech landscape.



Transitioning to the **Spring District**, a revitalized industrial area blossoming into a mixed-use residential neighborhood, delegates experienced the **Global Innovation Exchange (GIX)**. Here, they witnessed the transformative power of university-industry collaboration and technology innovation through cutting-edge graduate and professional development programs.



The day ended with a visit to the beautiful **Chateau Ste. Michelle**, where Washington State Governor Jay Inslee warmly welcomed the delegation. A presentation of Washington's thriving wine industry presented a vast number of partnership opportunities. The delegation learned more about the wine sector's ties to economic development, academia, small businesses, and its embrace of innovation and technology.

Tuesday, May 16th - Link to Video



ACE Delegates began their third day in Seattle with a trip to the northern part of the region to Snohomish County. They visited the family-operated **Swan Trail Farms** at the center of agricultural innovation that includes a working dairy farm, tourism, and events and is home to the **5G Agricultural Field Lab**. The public-private partnerships active at the site are focused on developing new capabilities to improve the resiliency of the agricultural sector.



After the visit, the ACE Delegation moved to the **Port of Everett**, where they learned about how the port creates economic opportunities and jobs, while also providing maritime and marine-related services and appropriate public access to the waterfront.



Following the Port visit, ACE Delegates traveled to Paine Field where they toured the aerospace giant **Boeing Everett Factory**, home to the largest manufacturing building in the world, where 767 and 777 airplanes are built. Delegates also visited neighboring **Aviation Technical Services**, a company providing support for maintenance and repair to military, commercial, and regional aircraft operators.



ACE Delegates rounded out the day at the **Boeing Future of Flight Building**, where they learned about the unique public-private partnership that brought commercial passenger service to **Paine Field** terminal. There they were welcomed by Snohomish County Executive Dave Somers and Mayor of Arlington Babara Tolbert.

Wednesday, May 17th - Link to Video



On the fourth day of their enriching journey through the Greater Seattle Region, ACE Delegates ventured south to Pierce County where they delved deeper into local innovation and strengthened global connections. They began their day with a visit to **Joint Base Lewis-McChord** where Delegates were introduced to cutting-edge technologies and strategies that are essential for providing operational support during disasters and driving economic recovery across countries



Next, the group visited the **Port of Tacoma**, which covers 2,400 acres and is North America's sixth-largest container gateway. Delegates embarked on a boat tour operated by the **Tacoma Youth Marine Center**, gaining insights into the port's pivotal role in fostering prosperity, and trade, supporting living wage jobs, and preserving the environment.



As the day progressed, delegates were dropped off at the **Center for Urban Waters**, a state-of-the-art facility that fosters collaboration between organizations with complementary missions. The center's primary objective is to develop innovative solutions for environmental restoration, protection, and sustainable urban development.



Afterward, the group took a short ride across the water to the **University of Washington-Tacoma Campus**. With more than 5,000 students enrolled, the university plays a significant role in regional economic development and the overall ecosystem.



Concluding the day, delegates crossed the iconic Bridge of Glass and arrived at the **Museum of Glass**, a world-renowned art museum dedicated to the craft and creativity of glassmaking. An evening reception offered a platform to forge new connections and solidify existing relationships built during the ACE program.

Thursday, May 18th - Link to Video



ACE Delegates began their day by learning about aviation and sustainability best practices from industry leaders like Alaska Airlines, Washington State University, and the Port of Seattle. The picturesque Seattle waterfront at the historic Edgewater Hotel provided a perfect backdrop for engaging discussions.



Next, the group journeyed across the breathtaking Puget Sound to Kitsap County aboard a public ferry. They were hosted for lunch at the **Kitsap Conference** Center at Bremerton Harborside. a state-of-theart facility boasting stunning waterfront views. A dynamic discussion facilitated by the Washington State Department of Commerce explored thriving industry clusters, including WAV-C, an autonomous vehicle cluster, and Maritime Blue, which is dedicated to sustainable maritime business development.



In the afternoon, ACE Delegates visited **SAFE Boats**, a reputable builder of reliable and durable safety and rescue vessels crucial for military, law enforcement, and fire professionals. The group also explored collaboration opportunities at the **Port of Bremerton**, which covers over 2,100 acres and has over 50 years of history, delving into industrial, maritime, and aviation business and investment prospects.



The next destination was the **Suguamish Port Madison** Indian Reservation, where Tribal Chairman Leonard Forsman and members of the Suguamish Tribe warmly welcomed ACE Delegates to the House of Awakened Culture, a community landmark and cultural center. The group gained valuable insights into tribal economic development efforts aimed at growing community resources while promoting the economic and social welfare of the Suguamish Tribe.



Upon returning to their hotel, Delegates joined ACE Meetups with like-minded participants to continue exploring cooperation opportunities on trade and investment, research and development, entrepreneurship and innovation, academic exchanges, and much more.

Friday, May 19th - Link to Video



The sixth and final day of the ACE Exchange in Seattle commenced at the **Starbucks Center Complex**, the global headquarters of the renowned coffee company, which sources coffee from over 500,000 farmers worldwide.



Next, the group met at the **Museum of Flight**, the world's largest independent, non-profit air and space museum celebrating Seattle's rich aviation history. Finally Mayor Dana Ralph of Kent, home to over half of Washington State's aerospace jobs, warmly welcomed the Delegates.



The ACE Delegates then visited the **Chihuly Glass Museum**, where they delved into the inspirations and influences of renowned glass artist Dale Chihuly. Over lunch, the **Washington State Department of Commerce** hosted presentations and a panel discussion on the importance of tourism, arts, and culture, emphasizing their significance and contribution to the economic development of the Greater Seattle Region.



The group proceeded to the **Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Institute**, where they toured the facility.



Delegates then connected with **Amazon Web Services** and **Amazon.com** to learn about the potentialities of Amazon Cloud and Amazon retail and Amazon Web Services in the Americas.



As part of the closing ceremony, participants watched a video from Ambassador Frank Mora who expressed gratitude to Seattle's local organizers on behalf of the United States Department of State - Permanent Mission to the OAS.



A short walk away, participants walked to the ACE Closing Ceremony gathered at **Amazon Spheres**, a collaborative indoor garden housing over 40,000 plants from cloud forest regions across 30 countries.

Seattle's Panorama:

Economic development landscape

Seattle, sometimes known as the Emerald City, is home to innovators, decision-makers, and business leaders from across the globe. Situated at the heart of the central Puget Sound region and positioned between the Olympic and Cascade Mountains, Puget Sound is the largest marine estuary by volume in the United States. It connects the region to the Pacific Ocean and joins the state of Washington and the province of British Columbia, Canada as part of the greater Salish Sea. The Snohomish, Puyallup, Green, Duwamish, Cedar and many other rivers and streams flow through the central Puget Sound region and define distinct river basins that encompass cities, farms, forests and mountains. It is this unique and remarkable natural environment that has drawn people to Puget Sound and sustained them for thousands of years. Puget Sound is part of a larger area that has been the traditional aboriginal territory of the Coast Salish peoples, who live around the Salish. The Coast Salish Tribes have lived here since time immemorial and, while each Tribe is unique, all share in having a deep historical connection and legacy of respect for the land and natural resources. These sovereign Tribal nations enrich the region through environmental stewardship, cultural heritage and economic development, and collaborate with local governments to shape the region's future.

The success of the region has been built upon sharing knowledge with the world. ACE 16 participants discovered opportunities for partnership during their visit to Seattle. The host program connected the delegation to some of the most innovative companies and institutions in the world.

Despite several setbacks in the region, Seattle's remarkable and innovative economic ecosystem continues to innovate and create novel solutions for its own people, the region, and the world at large.



Seattle's key clusters



The Aerospace industry in the central Puget Sound region is one of the most competitive in the world. The Boeing Company was founded in Seattle. Since then, the region's Aerospace industry has grown into a large and diverse supply chain that is driving innovation across clusters, including space, advanced composite materials and aerospace biofuels. The region is increasingly recognized as a hub of private sector space companies and employment. This growth is exemplified by expanding companies including Blue Origin, Vulcan Aerospace and SpaceX.



Information and Communication Technology. The region is home to a highly diverse Information and Communication Technology industry. This includes businesses in traditional software publishing, computer services, interactive media and others. Regional software companies like Microsoft, the world's largest software company, and Amazon, the world's largest retailer, form this industry cluster's backbone. Regional businesses and institutions are advancing the future of work through innovations in artificial intelligence and cloud computing.



Maritime. The region has leveraged its proximity to Asia, Alaska and Canada into a thriving Maritime industry, across boat building and repair, fishing and fishing products, and water passenger and cargo transportation. Communities, ports and other partners are planning for the future of the region's maritime industry. In 2019, Washington Maritime Blue published a strategy for the Blue Economy in Washington state, finding that the global ocean economy is expected to double by 2030 to \$3 trillion.



Life Sciences and Global Health. The region plays host to a thriving Life Sciences and Global Health industry that is advancing health in communities across the globe. Regional businesses and organizations are pushing advancements in biotechnology, diagnostics, bioagriculture, veterinary medicine, biofuels, medical devices, research and digital health/health IT. Several major universities and research organizations anchor this industry sector and have created an ecosystem for cross-sector collaboration and start-ups. These include Washington State University, the University of Washington, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, the Allen Institute for Brain Science and the Infectious Disease Research Institute.



Clean Technology. The region is home to thriving businesses on the leading edge of clean technology developments. Washington state has set a goal of having a 100% non-carbon emitting energy portfolio by 2045. As of 2018, 69% of Washington's energy came from hydroelectric sources, with natural gas, wind, biomass and nuclear rounding out the state's clean energy portfolio. Clean Technology is making inroads across several significant industry sectors in the region. Transportation and Logistics industries are reducing carbon emissions by transitioning to all-electric or hybrid fleets. The Aerospace industry is on the leading edge of researching sustainable aviation technologies such as electric aircrafts and hydrogen fuels. Information and Communication Technology businesses are developing energy efficient data processing models. The manufacturing sector produces solar panels, batteries and other clean materials. Innovative wood product companies are developing woody biomass as a sustainable energy source and new building technologies such as cross-laminated timber.



Military and Defense. Military installations in the region provide significant economic benefits to the region. The central Puget Sound region hosts several major military facilities, including Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Naval Base Kitsap and Naval Station Everett. In addition, the industry supports myriad private defense contractors and subcontractors, bolstering the regional Maritime and Aerospace industries.
